President's Report

Friends Afternoon Get-Together

Our first attempt to hold our annual get-together turned out to be the one day in March when really hot weather was forecast – 37 degrees! So, for everyone's comfort, we postponed the event, only to discover that on the day, it was a fine, pleasant 27 degrees!

The postponed event happened last Saturday (16 April), and although we had some rain, we were under cover at the education hub, and we had a good turnout of members, including our local (state) MP, Matt Fregan – a member for several years now.

We all enjoyed cakes, soft drinks, and a chance to catch up with FSCVR doings and events. There was a raffle for Australian plants and a nursery gift voucher, which was won by our youngest member (who is six years old!)

Friends Plantings

We have been able to fund an extra planting in Valley Conservation Reserve from our grant from City of Monash, so we will have 2 plantings in the Reserve in June:

- (1) On June 11th (Sunday), for members of FSCVR. This is also a What's Your Jam? Event.
- (2) On June 17th (Saturday) for members and supporters, and Valley Conservation Reserve neighbours.

In each case, we'll meet at the amenities block at 9:30am and look to finish before lunch.

We hope to plant 1100 plants in the two sessions thus continuing our work in restoring the bush in Valley Conservation Reserve.

May Meeting: Dr Gary Presland and Graham Ross

I have spoken about the important program aimed at rehabilitating and regenerating the Gardiners Creek catchment – of which Scotchmans Creek is a significant part. Five Cities (Monash, Whitehorse, Booroondara, Glen Eira and Stonnington) are involved in a long-term program called the Gardiners Creek Strategic Collaboration. As part of that program an alliance of Friends and other community groups has been formed, called the KooyongKoot Alliance (KKA).

As I noted last year, FSCVR made the decision to join KKA and Rex Dusting has been a regular attendee at KKA meetings, representing us.

The program is now gaining momentum, and has secured a substantial State Government grant to further its work, so we felt it was an appropriate time to invite the archaeologist and historian Dr Gary Presland to tell us about the history of Gardiners Creek, and the KooyongKoot Catchment Keeper, Graham Ross, to tell us what the KKA alliance is doing, and share a little of the vision for the future of Gardiners Creek.

This is an important opportunity to find out about the history, present and strategic vision for the future of our creek system.

February

Comments:

- No pH measurement was taken as there was no pH indicator available.
- Oxygen level was Good and Excellent for Sites 1a and 1b.
- The turbidity was low at Sites 1a, 1b and 2.
- The invertebrate survey ratings ('Waterwatch' method) were Poor for both the upstream sites.
- Valley Creek bed was virtually dry (no stream flow measured) and had very little litter.

March

Comments:

- No pH measurements were taken as there was no pH indicator available.
- Valley Creek was reduced to a trickle, with several poor or degraded phys/chem results, and the pools were too small for our invertebrates sampling method.
- The other 3 sites had better flows and all phys/chem results were Fair to Excellent (high conductivity at site 1a (Scotchmans Creek, upstream) was rated Fair, all the other results were rated Good to Excellent).
- Damselfly larvae and aquatic leeches were plentiful at site 2 (Scotchmans Ck, Regent St), however the overall invertebrates rating was Poor. The sample also caught some large tadpoles, one maturing with striped marsh frog patterning.
- We did not do the scheduled invertebrates sampling at Valley Creek, as noted above.

Autumn in Valley Conservation Reserve

This is the low season for flowers but I have noticed a few early acacias starting to show their yellow flowers. It is time for us to start thinking about planting those vacant spots in our gardens.
