## President's Report

After a very long summer, winter has now arrived and the overnight temperatures are rather low. We are still waiting for more rain to soak into the soil in preparation for our planting season. But the days have

mainly been sunny allowing us to walk in the sunshine through Valley Conservation Reserve to enjoy the lovely bushland.

#### **Planting Season:**

Our first planting in Valley Conservation Reserve took place as part of Huntingtower year 9 students Community
Outreach Program. About 20 students planted about 250 plants near the Regent Street entry. There will be two more sessions of planting with Huntingtower students over the next few weeks.

Our annual Friends planting will take place on Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> June. We have requested 800 plants for the Friends to plant so it will be a busy morning but very rewarding. We hope to see a good turnout of Friends.

Our big community planting event, National Tree Day, will be on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> July. We will continue planting in Stanley Reserve East on the south side of the creek. The area to be planted is just downstream of where we planted last year. This will be stage 2 of our 3 year grant for this area.

The details will be the same as last year except that we are requesting a gold coin donation to help us defray the cost of the sausage sizzle.

On the north side of the creek students from Brentwood Secondary College and staff from Novotel will plant 3000 plants over 2 days. Again this will be stage 2 of our 3 year grant for this area.

#### **More Events:**

Monash Council's "What's Your Jam" event has been renamed "Green Up Monash". We will participate in this event by encouraging people to join our work party on Saturday 31st May when we will offer some planting as well as the usual weeding. If you have not attended a work party for a while please join us.

We collaborated with the City Nature Challenge on our April work party afternoon. Unfortunately the day was rather wet but a few people ventured out to use iNaturalist to capture information about lots of different plants.

#### **April**

#### **Comments:**

- The water quality measurements are mostly Fair to Excellent, except for Poor or Degraded turbidity at 3 of the 4 sites. The cause of poor turbidity at site 1b (upstream site) is not obvious. Turbidity at site 2 (downstream) is probably from works on the adjacent retarding dam. The turbidity at site 3 (Valley Creek) is probably from recent dredging work in Valley Reserve.
- The invertebrate sample ratings at the upstream sites were both Poor. The loose sand in the creek beds has moved recently. At site 1a (Scotchmans Creek, upstream) there are new holes to beware of, and more aquatic vegetation which improves the areas that can be swept with the net. We found many caddisfly larvae (hydrotilidae, micro caddis), which are found in all water bodies but are hard to spot because of their tiny size and translucent silk cases (photo below).

#### May

#### **Comments:**

This survey was done on two separate days, because of limited attendance (initially 3 people) on the originally scheduled date of  $25^{th}$  May. We deferred the invertebrates survey to be a part of a year 10 school excursion that we were assisting on  $28^{th}$  May.

- Chemical results typical of the low flow conditions were: Low flow, low turbidity and high conductivity at site 1a (YSC010, Scotchmans Ck upstream of Blackburn Rd).
- Ammonium was higher below the Mt Waverley wetlands than above, which often occurs.
- Phosphorus results were better than usual.
- The invertebrates samples had more gambusia (mosquito fish) than usual, and unusually low counts of invertebrates.

## Guest Speaker - Local Spiders - "how to find a good web browser"

Our guest speaker for our May 21 meeting was local resident and nature enthusiast Ian Moodie who entertained us with his detailed photographs and stories on some of the many magnificent arachnids he has come across in the area. Have a look amongst your fish ferns and see what you can find – you may need a magnifying glass and if you see 2 big eyes looking back at you, it is likely to be one of possibly the largest group of spiders - jumping spiders, that have excellent depth perception.
