The bush crew are waiting for Covid-19 restrictions to be eased to allow them to plant in Fairway Reserve.

We are looking forward to putting in grant applications for more plants to be planted in 2021. We have been successful with our grant applications over many years and are grateful to Melbourne Water for their continued support.

# Membership Renewals - due 30th August


